



He coordinated events like Friday Movie Nights and Playtime in the Park at Dr. Loesch Family Park, which created fun and safe spaces while fostering community pride and connection. Through this work, Richard empowered young people to see themselves as leaders and change makers.





As manager of the Dorchester Winter Farmers Market for the last three years, Richard supports local farmers and small businesses while expanding access to healthy food. Under his leadership, the market thrived with the launch of a coupon program that made nutritious food more accessible and affordable. His ability to connect people also brought partners and resources together, further strengthening the community.

Richard is also the owner of Watch the Krown, a small business focused on empowerment and impact. Through his brand, he creates natural hair products with the mission of inspiring people to drive progress and make a lasting difference.

CIVIC LEADERSHIP AWARD



The mission of Montserrat Aspirers Inc. MAI is to give aspiring youth the opportunity to gain a competitive edge in this changing society through workshops, academic tutoring, scholarship awards and cultural activities. MAI encourages collaboration among community organizations and promotes self-pride, ethnic and cultural diversity.

MAI was organized in 1974 for charitable community and educational purposes. In an effort to obtain a more visible community presence and to better assist the community, the organization bought the building located at 358 Washington Street, Dorchester MA in 1992. After years of hard work by mostly members and friends the Aspirers Community Center was opened to the public in June 1994. Three years later, the hard work and dedication was once again displayed when the basement was officially opened on Sunday, October 19, 1997.

Since 1988 annual scholarships have been awarded to high school seniors from area schools and in 1991 a tutoring program was established to help community children. In an effort to meet the increasing needs of the inner-city youth and provide a higher level of educational services., MAI's tutorial program was renamed the Henrietta Browne College Preparatory Program in the fall of 2003.

MAI is passionate about its community service and always consider it a critical aspect of the growth of the organization. Over more than 50 years, MAI has offered the following: field trips to educational sites such as colleges and museums; career awareness day workshops; scholarship awards to more than 100 first year college students; hosted civic organizations; tutoring to public and private school students; support for cultural activities and events; and community outreach, training, and development of workforce initiatives

MAI's programs and goals have been formally recognized by the Mayor of Boston, Members of Congress, the Supreme Court, State Representatives, City Councilors, local businesses, members of the community it serves, and other organizations locally and internationally. This organization continues to provide and improve the myriad of services it offers to its community and is grateful to those who have supported MAI over the years. The organization appeals to the private and public sector for support of its fundraising efforts as we continue to be a beacon of light in this community.

Victoria is the oldest of four siblings. She was born in West Roxbury, where she often felt out of place in school until the 6th grade at the age of 13 when she moved to Codman Square and began attending the John D. O'Bryant School. Immersed in a community rich with culture and inclusivity, she started to feel a strong sense of belonging. Surrounded by empowering youth and exposed to popular education, she grew eager to learn—not only about her peers, but also about herself.

With a passion for listening and understanding, she joined the Youth Justice and Power Union (YJPU). Through YJPU, she has organized protests, facilitated community events, and spoken at city hall testimonies alongside other youth and city leaders, advocating for the importance of youth voices in shaping the future.

Beyond YJPU, she has also dedicated four years to Sisters Unchained, an organization that supports girls of color whose parents are or have been incarcerated. As a lead facilitator, she teaches the importance of mental health, essential life skills, and self-empowerment—helping young women work toward the best version of themselves.

These experiences have instilled in her valuable skills that she carries every day: the ability to communicate across diverse audiences, remain calm under pressure, and deeply connect with youth. Her journey has shown her the power of community, advocacy, and education—tools that she will continue to use to uplift others and create meaningful change.
